Glad Bryce, author of the book “First In, Last Out, The RCAF Women’s Division & Nursing Sisters of WWII”, has been a member of the University Women’s Club of Toronto since 1974. She has served as President of the Graduates of the Toronto Club for 5 years and has been on the Board intermittently for a total of 21 years.

Ms. Bryce’s latest book, “First In, Last Out” was released in the spring of 2010. “First In Last Out” celebrates the entry of women into the RCAF and documents their experiences during World War II. Dozens of interviews with WDs provide compelling personal accounts of what it was like to be a woman in what was, at that time, a ‘man’s world.’

The personal stories are interwoven with narratives, photos and historical documentation, to bring the events of the past to life with the added perspective of the women’s reflections sixty years later.

Also included in the book is a section about the Nursing Sisters. The purpose of the book is two-fold: to honour the women and their stories and to donate proceeds from the book to be used for Heritage Fund scholarships for women.

Since 1997, Glad has been the Secretary of the University Women’s Club (Toronto) Heritage Fund. After graduating from York University with an Honours B.A. in Sociology in 1971, Glad completed an M.A. in Sociology (Adult Education) at the University of Toronto. Her book, “Divorce and Spiritual Growth” provided a healing presence in the Anglican Church’s struggle with divorced persons during the late seventies and eighties. Glad’s other books include academic volumes on inner city education, the role of women in academia, a training manual for parents and a book on marriage preparation.
